## **Preparation Checklist for a Flea Treatment**

|  | If a dog or cat is the source of the infestation they should be taken to a groomer or veterinarian for a professional flea bath and then placed on the "Advantage Program" (or similar treatment). |
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|  | Remove all shoes, toys and other items from the floor area in all hall and bedroom closets.  |
|  | Remove all items stored under beds as well as clothes, toys etc. from all bedroom floors. (may be placed on top of beds).  |
|  | Move furniture (where possible) in all other rooms away from the walls and generally reduce all clutter on the floors.   |
|  | Remove pet food and water bowls from the floor.  |
|  | Fish tanks should be covered with a towel and air pumps turned off.  |
|  | All carpeted areas as well as upholstered furniture should be thoroughly vacuumed within 24 hours prior to the treatment and the vacuum bag discarded immediately.                                 |
|  | Vacate the premises during the treatment and do not re-enter for at least 4 hours after the treatment has been completed. This includes the pets.  |
|  | <b><u>Be Cautious on re-entry</u></b> – tile and hardwood floors <u>may</u> be slippery but will soon dry  |
|  | Flea eggs may still hatch up to 45 days after the treatment but will quickly die.  |
